Introduction

- 1. <u>Illustration</u>: a woman who was terminally ill.
- 2. <u>Illustration</u>: a boy at school who was foolish.
- 3. Both had their warning but ignored it.

1. <u>GOD GRACIOUSLY WARNS MEN BEFORE JUDGEMENT</u> <u>FALLS</u>

- 1) This is not perhaps always true, but it is so generally:
 - (i) Adam got a warning first: "surely die"
 - (ii) Those of <u>Noah's</u> day: 120 years
 - (iii) To some extent those in <u>Sodom:</u> Lot's words
 - (iv) So too: <u>Belshazzar</u> / the <u>Jews</u> of Christ's day
- 2) <u>Why</u> does God warn people?
 - (i) He has <u>no pleasure</u> in their death
 - (ii) He would prefer them to repent
 - (iii) God loves to be <u>gracious</u> (Isaiah 55; Matthew 11)<u>DOCTRINE</u>: God must punish sin if we do not repent.
- 3) Amos preached in 8th Century BC to <u>Israel</u> (N.); he repeatedly warns the people here:
 - (i) v.4: formal worship
 - (ii) v.7/8: no rain yet no repentance
 - (iii) v.9: no <u>fruit</u> yet no repentance
 - (iv) v.10: <u>pestilence</u> yet no repentance
 - (v) v.11: fearful <u>punishments</u> yet ignored
- 4) So now, God declares he will meet them in judgement the ref. to <u>Assyria</u> (6:27)
 - <u>APPLICATION</u>: This is the difference between a fool and a wise man: one prepares and the other does not. Have you noticed Proverbs 27:12?

2. <u>WHY DO PEOPLE NOT PREPARE PROPERLY TO MEET</u> <u>THEIR GOD?</u>

- 1) Some, because <u>ignorant</u> of what lies ahead of them:
 - (i) "we must needs <u>die</u>..."
 - (ii) "it is appointed unto <u>all</u> men..."
 - (iii) "it is a <u>fearful thing</u> to fall..."
 <u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: so <u>recently</u> in the news: 3 in a car / an acrobat on tight-rope / soldier in Afghan.
 <u>APPLICATION</u>: O that we might be well prepared!
- Some, because they are <u>too proud</u> to read the Bible or listen to a preacher: "I am an Atheist / Agnostic / Free-Thinker".
 <u>OBSERVE</u>: But all these must meet their God.
- 3) All this is a message to us to make sure <u>we</u> are preparing to meet our God:
 - (i) It is hard to do so today because in this country society is <u>very hard</u>.
 - (ii) We see only a very <u>small few</u> who today are serious.
 - (iii) <u>Satan</u> is very active keeping people busy with <u>the good life</u>: sport / leisure / entertainment / money...
- 4) <u>Stop and think</u> about this:
 - (i) Have you experienced <u>conversion</u> or are you just blessed with a good upbringing?
 - (ii) Does <u>God's Spirit</u> bear witness with your spirit that you are saved?
 - (iii) Is <u>salvation</u> the absolutely first thing in your life? <u>APPLICATION</u>: O listen: "Prepare to meet thy God".

3. THINGS TO KNOW IF YOU ARE TO BE PREPARED

- Seeking will not save you you must <u>find</u> Christ if you are to be prepared:
 <u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: the pearl; the treasure.
 <u>OBSERVE</u>: "Ever learning..." How sad!
- 2) Conversion is a <u>radical change</u> of heart: "new birth" "new creature" "all things are become new" "new heart".

<u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: a little ball of gold – tested.

- We are <u>prepared</u> for judgement as soon as we have <u>believed in</u> <u>Christ</u>:
 <u>OBSERVE</u>: It need not take years + years.
 <u>Proof</u>: the Ethiopian / Lydia / gaoler...
- We are prepared to die if we have a love for the gospel + a hatred of sin:
 <u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: our thoughts when in secret we call it

phantasising

5) This is what a converted Christian is: someone who is prepared, well-prepared to meet God: the garment / the blood / the banner / the armour / the joy of meeting God soon
